Norwina is an associate professor at the Department of Architecture, Kulliyah of Architecture and Environmental Design (KAED), International Islamic University Malaysia since 1998. She was the first Head of Department for Architecture programme in 1998-2001 and again in 2010. She has held the post of Deputy Dean Student Affairs and Academic Advisor for B. Arch programme in between her services in IIUM. She is the current Unit Coordinator for Islamic Architectural Heritage Unit (ISArcH) to spearhead the niche area of KAED in Islamic architecture and KAED's Head of Internationalisation and Global Network.

As a registered Architect, Architect (Ar) Norwina is also a Fellow of the Malaysian Institute of Architects (PAM) active in architectural education, international Affairs Committee and formerly in Continuing Professional Development committees for fellow members. She represent PAM as an Executive Member of the Union of International Architect-Public Health Group Work Programme (UIA-PHG) and the UIA- Architecture for All Region IV work programme. She is also a member of the Global University Public Health Architecture (GUPHA) in her contribution to healthcare architecture elective course and selected projects in IIUM. She is currently a Malaysian Institute of Architects representative in the Committee for Social Responsibility in the Asian Council of Architects (ARCASIA) for social works and one of the expert member of the Industrialised Building System (IBS) of the Malaysian Construction

Industry Development Board (CIDB) in promoting modular coordination and IBS through research, practice and teaching. Under CIDB, she is recently as been appointed as committee member in the technical revision of the UBBL for 2017. With Board of Architects, she is among the resource person as Accreditation and Validation panel under Council of Architectural Accreditation Malaysian (CAAM) as well as Supervisor/Examiner for LAM-Part 2 Architecture Examination Panelist.

Her experiences include her role as a public architect in the Public Works Department (PWD/JKR) for 29 years from 1979-2008, i.e in the Medical and Health Works Branch from 1979 to 1990, the Core Team of the Asian Development Bank Loan projects at the Ministry of Health Malaysia from 1990-1998, and in involved in the setting up of the IIUM architecture programme until full accreditation from 1998 to 2008 as secondment officer. Upon her optional retirement from the PWD/JKR she is currently employed as a contract teaching staff to date. While in academia and in keeping with professional practices, she continues in consultancy capacity as a health facility planner and architect to the industry including monitoring the IIUM Teaching Hospital construction recently completed in 2016 as an independent health facility planner under the Public Private Partnership (PPP) procurement system through IIUM Specialist Centre under Kulliyyah of Medicine, IIUM and as the architect team member for the Azlan city master plan project.
